Deadline for submissions will be on 30 November 2016. The consolidate TRIP will consequently be presented to the INFRACOM by December for approval. The draft guidelines for the preparations of the RDIPs were also prepared by the NROs subject to the issuance of the national guidelines to be released by the NEDA Central Office.
